# How Do We Help Our Students Succeed? Strong Academics, Family Partnerships, and Community Networks

### VITAL COMMUNITY NETWORKS

In recognizing the diversity and breadth of our students' needs, we have created an expansive network throughout Chicago and beyond to add support for our students' goals. Our collaborative approach ensures that, year over year, we are equipped to help provide the necessary opportunities for individual and collective growth.

Cultivating strategic corporate engagement and community opportunities, we tap into a network of resources to address the evolving needs of our families. By leveraging external partnerships, we empower our students to explore their interests.

Thanks to the vast network of volunteers and other stakeholders, students receive vital career exploration and skill-building opportunities, as well as mentorship.

These connections extend beyond a child's present, laying the foundation for a lifetime of support, guidance, and shared experiences that contribute to their holistic development and sustained success.

### **INTENSE ACADEMIC SUPPORT**

At the core of our commitment to our students are our academic support programs. These supports begins with meticulous attention to the school selection process, emphasizing the importance of finding the best fit for each student. When necessary, Horizons helps families access schools that would otherwise not be an option due to financial barriers.

Our dedicated program managers ensure that students not only stay on track but often surpass grade-level expectations through a personalized approach. Thanks to this attention to detail, students receive interventions before they fall behind. Supports include services such as tutoring and diverse learning resources like diagnostic testing and IEP advocacy. Through a distinctive blend of academic monitoring and targeted interventions, we tailor our approach to address individual needs comprehensively.

This commitment extends seamlessly from kindergarten through a student's postsecondary education. Our dedication to understanding and meeting the evolving needs of our students at every step of their educational trajectory is fundamental to our model. We strive to empower students to achieve their full potential and flourish academically.

### STRONG FAMILY PARTNERSHIPS

We acknowledge that fostering academic success cannot be accomplished in a vacuum. At the heart of our organizational model is the belief that the whole family plays a pivotal role in shaping a student's educational journey.

We actively partner with families, offering support in ways that empower families to succeed. This approach involves coaching families to become effective advocates for their children and empowering them to actively participate in and contribute to their child's educational experience.

Recognizing that impact extends beyond the classroom, we strive to provide families with a network that can address their broader needs.

Through partnership, we create a collaborative and supportive ecosystem that nurtures not only the academic growth of the students but their overall opportunity for success.

# Congratulations to our Class of 2024!

The Class of 2024 is off to a strong start, with our students beginning their first semester of college in the fall of 2024. Over the summer, our annual Senior Shopping Day, in partnership with Fresh Wave and Target, was a huge success. With our partners' generosity, we helped the students gather all the essentials for their new college experiences. Many of the students also took advantage of the transition-to-college workshops provided by our post-secondary partner, UtmostU, which covered important topics like time management and budgeting, preparing them for the challenges ahead.

This year's students are pursuing a wide range of academic fields. Caitlyn is studying Aerospace Engineering at Arizona State University, while Anahi is majoring in Nursing at the University of Iowa. Jovonne is focused on Secondary Education at Illinois State University, Vernon is pursuing Computer Science at Lewis University, and Antonio is studying Food Science at the University of Illinois. Each student is on an exciting path, ready to make their mark in their respective fields. We are excited to continue watching their journeys unfold!

# Aaliyah G. & Our Utmost U Partnership

We met Aaliyah in elementary school. Since then, she has been making her way towards post-secondary success. After attending Harold Washington for her freshman year, Aaliyah transferred to Worsham School of Mortuary Science, where she is pursuing a full-time program in mortuary science. With graduation expected in 2026, she is preparing for a career as a funeral director and embalmer.

Our key partner, Utmost U, has been incredibly valuable to her, especially in the early stages of her college journey. She is grateful for the initial Zoom meetings with our team and our partners, which offered guidance on making friends and adjusting to dorm life. Knowing that there was someone in her corner made her transition easier.

Utmost U is a program partner that helps support Horizons' post-secondary activities. Without participation in Horizons, students cannot access Utmost U's platform.

# DJ & Alternative Post-Secondary Pathways

DJ joined Horizons in 2009. After graduating from high school, DJ explored a few options to get real-world experience without having to go back to the classroom. With help from Horizons' post-secondary resources, DJ enrolled in the no-cost program with HACIA U to complete an apprenticeship in general construction.

He says, "I would like to thank Horizons for Youth for the tremendous amount of effort and dedication they put into all of their students. I can truly say without Horizons, I do not know what I would be doing. Throughout my 12+ years at Horizons, there has never been a dull moment and there was never anything I was afraid to ask [for]. They have always been there and helped open up new doors that I thought wouldn't open. I am extremely grateful that my family was chosen to be a part of Horizons and can't wait to see what the future holds!"

DJ will be joining ComEd full-time thanks to his apprenticeship! We encourage our students to figure out what makes the most sense to them in their post-secondary years.



















# Highlighting Our Programs

Each year, our model is made up of programming that helps students holistically inside and outside of the classroom. This past year, elements such as getting our students into their best-fit schools and continuing to expand our post-secondary pathways opportunities stood out.

### **Best-Fit Schools for All Students**

Finding a best-fit school is essential for a student's academic success and personal well-being. It allows them to thrive in an environment that aligns with their needs, learning style, and future goals. Roughly fifty percent of our students are enrolled at private or parochial schools.

Our programming is designed to support students as they navigate the process of finding that perfect fit, whether transitioning from private to public school, or adjusting to high school or college life. We recognize that a student's needs can change over time, and we are committed to providing the guidance and resources necessary to make those transitions seamless.

Whether it's offering public school application assistance, connecting students with tuition aid, or providing access to academic support programs that helps with transitioning, our model's emphasis on best-fit schools for each student ensures they have the support they need.

One of our students recently experienced this firsthand when he transitioned from a private school to a public school within the Chicago Public Schools (CPS) system. After making the move, he found a renewed sense of belonging, fitting in better with his peers and enjoying the classroom structure and resources at his new school.

The academic counseling and tutoring services we provided, along with tailored transition support, played a key role in helping him make a smooth adjustment. This example underscores the importance of recognizing that the best-fit school can take many forms; both private and public school partners can provide the right environment for our students to flourish.

Through ongoing support and individualized guidance, we strive to help each student find their best path to success.

### **Progressive Post-Secondary Pathways Expansion**

Our post-secondary programming continued to expand this year as we work towards building out more robust options for post-secondary pathways year after year.

For example, this past year, we held a Progressive Pathways Career Fest for high school students. This was a key initiative aimed at expanding career exploration for students, particularly focusing on opportunities that do not require a four-year degree, as that's our biggest area for growth.

During the summer, we included a visit to Malcolm X College as part of our College Visit program, showcasing both transfer options for students aiming for four-year institutions and certification programs for those interested in progressive pathways.

Additionally, we worked with our Public Allies intern to develop a Progressive Pathway catalog, which highlights various post-secondary programs supporting goals that don't involve attending a traditional four-year college.

In the past, we have been able to diversify post-secondary options for our 9th-11th graders, such as a visit to Metropolis Coffee Company where students explored careers in coffee and toured the roastery. Last school year, we attended a workshop at DePaul University's Coleman Center, where students learned about entrepreneurship and how to develop personal skills for starting their own businesses. Looking ahead, we are excited about our recent connection with a mentor from Amazon's Future Engineer Program, an initiative designed to guide students into software engineering without following the traditional four-year college path.

This highlights the variety of options we aim to provide our students. When looking towards their future pathway to success, there's no one-size fits all. Horizons has been working hard to ensure all of our students are supported on their career paths.

# Celebrating Our Community

### **Community Partners of the Year: Brookfield Properties**

We are so proud to partner with Brookfield Properties once more this year. Their outstanding support in various parts of our programming helps keep our mission going year to year. This past year, Brookfield Properties provided volunteers for events, including the Back-to-School Picnic, and fully hosted the December Partnership Party, taking charge of organizing all activities, food, and holiday gifts (hats and gloves for every child in our families). During the holiday season, they adopted two families for our Adopt-a-Family initiative. Brookfield Properties sponsored 2024's On Cloud Nine and actively participated by sending staff members to volunteer that evening.

We are so grateful that they have consistently nominated Horizons for their internal fundraisers, including Brookfield Cares Day, which raised approximately \$7,000 for Horizons, and their annual staff holiday raffles this past year! We are excited to continue partnering with Brookfield in 2025 and for years to come.



### Tutor of the Year: Olivia LaRocco

Olivia LaRocco has been an integral part of the Horizons for Youth community, tutoring for five years, including the past three years as a dedicated 1:1 paired tutor with our student Quetzali. He described Olivia as a blessing to his daughter, not only as a tutor, but also as a role model, confidant, and trusted friend. Olivia's support goes beyond academics—her calming presence helps Quetzali navigate the challenges she faces at school, particularly with peer interactions. Their shared love for cats has created a strong bond, and they are always looking forward to tutoring sessions. Olivia's dedication and personal connection with Quetzali have been invaluable, and her commitment to fostering growth and confidence is deeply appreciated by the family.
